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# **Aunt Mannys Project**

## **Materials**

Approx. 1/4 yard muslin (makes 3)

3 fabric strips 12" x 1"

Poly Fiber Fill

Black embroidery floss or thread

Cinnamon

Scissors

Needle

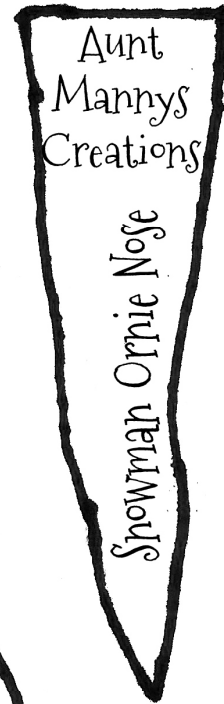
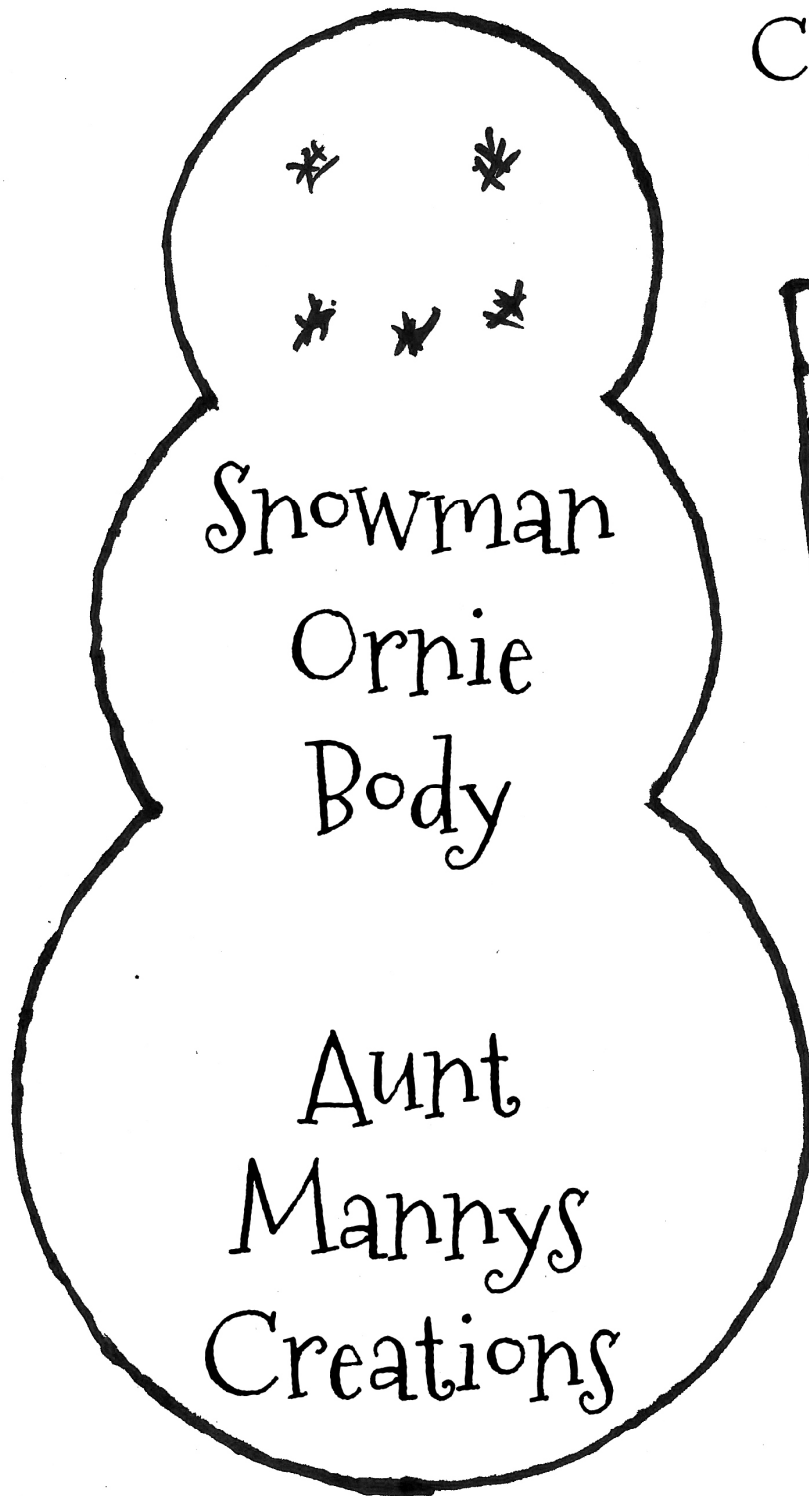
# Aunt Mannys Snowman Ornie

## Instructions

1. Trace each snowman and nose piece on doubled muslin.
2. Sew on trace line all the way around.
3. Cut out snowman and make a small slit on one side of each snowman but only through one layer of muslin. This is where you will turn and stuff your snowman.
4. Turn and stuff each snowman firmly and sew slit shut with regular white thread.
5. Cut out your snowman nose and turn right side out.
6. Stuff firmly and sew by hand to snowman face.
7. Eyes & Mouth: Using black thread, decide where you would like your eyes and mouth to be. Start sewing your eyes with random in and out stitches in roughly the shape of an eye. Do the same for the mouth (see pattern piece).
8. Scarf: Fold your scarf pieces in half longways and right sides facing in. Sew a 1/8" seam from one end to the other. Turn right side out.
9. Wrap and tie your scarf around your snowman's neck and tack in place with a needle and thread.
10. Grubby: Lastly, rub some cinnamon all over your snowman to give him a grubby aged look. Dust off any extra cinnamon. Or paint him with a little coffee and let dry.
